I think most of you have heard by now that our lovely little trip up the east coast for 4 weeks was rudely interrupted. We were supposed to head up to Massachusetts in the second week of August, right after

our visit to Gainesville. But on August 4th Cindy was diagnosed with breast cancer. It was not a shocking diagnosis because several women in her family have had breast cancer. (Genetic testing was negative.) Cindy & her oncology surgeon decided pretty quickly on a double mastectomy & the surgeon had an opening on August 15th, so we postponed our trip. Everything started out as expected & Cindy came home the same night. But my "Oh, Cindy is strong & will heal quickly - I'll just have a hard time keeping her in bed" ended when she started having terrible symptoms at home. The surgeon had told us to call if there were any problems, but no one answered my pages. Apparently, a new guy on the phones texted the surgeon instead of paging, which of course did not wake the surgeon. I hesitated to call EMS. I wasn't sure they would listen to me or even if they would take Cindy back to the same hospital where she'd had surgery, so I called & left messages for everyone in our church. About 5am, sweet Jim LaChappell answered & came immediately. He helped me get Cindy into the car & I drove her back to the hospital. On the drive, I finally reached the surgeon, so the ER was ready when we got there. I think there were 8 doctors who went immediately to work on her.

The next few days were dramatic even for this drama diva. She had two severe medication reactions. One caused heart damage the other caused kidney damage. They had to reopen her surgical site to clear out hematomas. Five days later, she was stable enough to come home again. My church family was with us every moment, even keeping watch so that I could sleep. She came home on my birthday, the 20th and said, "Oh honey. I didn't even get you a card. Well, I didn't die. So happy birthday!"

Today is Aug 30th, our 20th wedding anniversary. She is healing & doctors feel confident that she is strong & enough of an athlete to heal completely. Unsurprisingly, all of her doctors & nurses loved her & even in her bed, she tried to grin for the camera:



We plan to fly together to Maryland for a concert at Covenant United Methodist. The surgeon says Cindy can fly. We cannot thank all of you enough for your prayers.
