I love Christmas and Christmas music, so I was especially happy to be invited to do a Christmas concert and fundraiser at Saint John the Apostle MCC in Fort Myers, Florida. I always love Florida since I'm warm AND in Florida, I'm sort of considered middle-aged still – not that anyone lives to be 134, but you get the idea. They were so gracious to me, flew me in to Fort Myers, and offered lovely accommodations for me with a member. Myers, I left work sick and stopped at the doc to find I had influenza B. I got my flu shot early this year and apparently after the first batch of vaccine went out, they added a common strain of influenza B before the next batch went out. I started on all the right meds, but I was absolutely miserably congested.

Fortunately, if there's anyplace that it is okay to be human, it is MCC! I knew I couldn't stay in someone's home, because no matter how many times someone says, "Sure, it's fine to get up at 3 in the morning and turn on the lights to make hot tea," you just know you're never going to do it. To my great relief, one of you regular donors provided a hotel room with a microwave, so I really was up all night and day drinking tea until concert time. The concert was wonderful. I got to work with their new music director, Timothy, and the choir. John and Don did my sound perfectly and – as I said, humanly – I just put a box of Kleenex up there and had half of them in a pile next to me by the end of the concert. But, my prayer team got me through and I think I hit every note. I got to catch up with so many people I hadn't see in years and some local-ish friends came to help me with CD and book sales. It was a wonderful feeling of visiting home.

On Sunday morning I got the chance to work with their music director and the choir again. Timothy was great – a perfect balance between including as many people as

possible and making sure everyone felt welcomed and appreciated in the choir, and bringing the best sounds out of all of us. Pastor Steve gave me the sermon time and I felt like the Holy Spirit touched all of our hearts.

When I flew back to Nashville, our own church, Brentwood United Methodist Church (BUMC), said they were looking for a song about Christmas from Joseph's perspective. Hurray! Some of you will remember the Christmas album that Rev. Glenna Shepherd produced for me with about 17 other LGBT+ Christian artists, "*The Gift is on the Inside.*" We recorded a song by my old friend Bob Ayala called Song of Joseph. SO, I tried to dust off my guitar and get the chords in order. But my playing is rustier than ever with arthritic hands. So I hit upon the idea of asking one of the dozens and dozens of kids in the BUMC high school choir. I hadn't found any takers when I went up to Andrew Byers and said, "It really only has 4 chords in it. But maybe we could do it another time." He was a sport; listened to the song; played it right immediately which reminded me of Pete Jacobs in my old old group, Children of the Day, and sang it with me for all four services at our church on December 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>. I was excited. Our church is not generally a "special music" kind of place AND not necessarily a folksy song kind of place. But it went so perfectly with the pastor's sermon, and Andrew was SO good that it was a hit. I had to laugh when Cindy listened to him play it and said, "It sounds so different when *he* play it, honey." Yup. That's my honest wife.



Sadly, age has caught with me yet again this week. I have dislocated my right shoulder and torn my rotator cuff, so travel (and baggage handling) are off the table at present. ### **What You Have to Say**

*"It's hard for me to believe what you and CJ (that's what they call Cindy) have done for our church – well, for your church. I know that from your perspective you've been fighting this fight for decades now. But your strength and fail in the struggle for LGBTQ+ people here means so much. I didn't know there was any purpose in me coming out even as an ally until you explained it. And I see by your actions that you live out the things you talk about. Your faith and strength are a rock for all of us."*

*"I still think a gift like yours was never given to be used in a corner. But the danger of coming out was clear. Somehow I get the feeling that your mentors (like Freda Smith) understood that mentoring someone with gifts and a calling like yours was*

*a pretty important responsibility. The anointing (one your ministry) is just so present, so powerful, for freeing people - yet it seems like your story, and your anointing, stand so at the crossroads of all that is going on today and this disrupts so many formerly comfortable narrative. You've had wonderful mentors. I don't know what encountering you and your gifts the first time did to Freda's or Troy's or Jeri Ann's or Chuck Smith's narratives about "church" - but I'd pretty much bet it was both exhilarating and a bit frightening."*  
*\*From Marsha: I don't feel like I am in a battle against anyone. In fact we know that we "battle not against flesh and blood but against principalities and powers in high place." I do think that standing one's ground in faith can be threatening to some people and THEY feel like they're in a battle against us. That is not my perspective. I like Galatians 5:1 "Stand fast in the liberty in which Christ has made you free and do NOT be entangled again in a yoke of bondage." That's all we're doing and inviting others to do.)*
